

Nomenclature

Nomenclature is knowing the name of something.

These first few weeks in the atrium, we've learned the names of the articles of the Mass/Altar (paten, chalice, altar, altar cloth, crucifix). We are learning the Liturgical Colors (purple, green, red, white) and the Vestments of the Priest (alb, stole, chasuble, cincture). And now we are headed into the church for a tour to see the real articles of the Mass, the chasubles worn by the priest, and explore the place where we worship.

The children find great joy in exploring the church and them come to have a certain sense of ownership in the space where they too come to worship God at Mass.





In Level One, we spent a lot of time looking at individual prayers in the Mass - Reading the Holy Bible, Epiclesis, Offering, Lavabo, and the Sign of Peace. In Level Two, we have been exploring more deeply these individual moments but we are also going to explore them in the Mass in the order they go in.

We look at how the Mass is one prayer (our greatest prayer) made of many prayers. We see how they are in a beautiful order. As we recall this is 2nd grade, we'll add the prayer words that go with each moment in order. In 3rd grade, the children enjoy making their own missals with the prayers in the order of the Mass.

Structure of the Mass

We've looked for <u>years</u> at the major prayers in the Mass and the order of the Mass. Now we look at *each* prayer in the Mass and the parts of the Mass in the Structure of the Mass. This is a very big work! We look at The Liturgy of the Word and the prayers within it. We look at the Preparation for Communion, The Eucharistic Prayer, and Communion.



This is a very in depth look at the Mass. We particularly look at the Eucharistic prayer which is the heart of our liturgy.

Hopefully, this inspires us to greater appreciation, participation, and love for our Catholic Mass.
